

MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS (MIST)

MIST 201 - Management Information Systems and Applications (3 Credits)

The purpose of this course is to examine the technical, business and management aspects of management information systems through the study of MIS theory and concepts. Emphasis is placed on how and why different types of information systems have become an essential part of organizations. Students gain experience solving real world business problems using different information systems applications throughout the course.

MIST 411 - Information Security (3 Credits)

Prerequisite: MIST 201 or equivalent; and business administration major or permission of department chair. This course provides an understanding of the concepts involved in securing information, both from a technical and business perspective. Skills required to analyze and evaluate the security of information from a variety of viewpoints are presented. Current research is used to discuss management issues associated with creating policies and implementing procedures for information security in organizations. Cross-listed with MMIS 540.
